God's Money In My Purse

When Christ began His ministry in Jerusalem, one of the first things He did was to drive the money changers out of the temple. Three and a half years later, as He neared the end of His ministry, the money changers had returned to the temple. Notice what the Bible says Christ did: "And Jesus went into the temple of God, and cast out all them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the money changers, and seats of them that sold doves, and said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves." Matthew 21:12, 13.

Not long ago a newspaper reported that a large church found itself short of operating funds. The church devised a most ingenious scheme to raise the needed funds. It had printed raffle tickets and sold chances on a case of liquor. One member, after having been taught how to gamble by the church, become the proud possessor of a case of liquor, by which he could become intoxicated.

Some defend such practices, rationalizing that they are necessary in order to finance the preaching of the gospel. It would not be necessary to stoop to such practices if we would study the Bible and follow God's plan for giving the gospel.

Not a green stem was left on the other side, but God had kept His promise and had rewarded the farmer's faith by protecting his crop from the locusts.
