1. John saw another beast coming up out of what? <u>Revelation 13:11</u>

In previous lessons we have learned that "beasts" in prophecy represent nations, and that the "sea" and the "earth" represent, respectively, the eastern and western hemispheres. The nation, therefore, represented by this beast which was "coming up" at the very time that the first beast of <u>Revelation 13</u> was taken "into captivity" (<u>Revelation 13:11, 10</u>), in a continent uncrowded by "peoples, and multitudes, and nations, and tongues" (Compare <u>Genesis 1:10</u> with <u>Revelation 17:15</u>), is none other than the United States of America.
